II. What is the primary method of Satan?

The first appearance of Satan in Scripture is in Genesis. Genesis is the book of foundations. One principle of Bible study is the "Principle of the First Mention." The first mention of something in the Bible is often very revealing about the substance and character of that something. This is the case with, "that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan" (Revelation 12:9). Let's look at his method of work.

1. Genesis 3:1-6, 13

Genesis 3:1 tells us that the serpent was more _____ than any beast of the field. The word subtle means crafty, cunning, or tricky. The serpent (Satan) used his trickery to get Eve to do what he wanted her to do.

Not only are the words of a false prophet deceitful, but his appearance may be deceitful as well.

4. II Corinthians 11:13-15

Satan is an imitator or counterfeiter. The goal of a counterfeiter is to make a fake object appear to be the real thing. The goal is to deceive people into thinking that what they have is genuine when in reality they only possess an imitation.

Satan specializes in getting people to believe his lies. He even mixes some truth with his lies. His false prophets (many of whom are deceived themselves) might be very nice, sincere people. His false doctrines might sound good. Therefore, we must beware of Satan and how he works.

EXAMPLE: The book of Galatians was written by Paul to the churches in Galatia. These churches had been deceived by some who came to them preaching a false Gospel. (Read Galatians 1:6-9) Paul uses the much of the book of Galatians to convince these churches of the truth that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. (Specifically Galatians 2:16-21 & Galatians 3:1-11, 21-26) I do not believe these churches would have deliberately

chosen to forsake the truth; yet they were accepting false doctrine taught to them by false prophets who appeared to be the apostles of Christ. THEY WERE DECEIVED.

5. Ephesians 4:14

Satan uses false prophets. Satan uses false appearances. Satan uses false doctrine or false teaching. As the father of lies, Satan is the author of every false doctrine taught in the world today. The false doctrines are lies meant to deceive us. This explains the great variety of religions and churches in the world today.

In Conclusion

Satan is working all the time to destroy the faith of Christians. Satan uses all kinds of trickery and deceptions by perverting God's Word to make people believe that man-made doctrines are the divine truth.

Paul says in 2 Corinthians 2:11, "Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of his _____." Satan has many devices or methods of deceit. He sends false prophets. He disguises evil as good.

Satan is a master at what he does. Those who are deceived by Satan are not even aware that they are deceived. This should cause us to be aware and watchful and motivate us to seek to know the truth and to get victory over Satan.

IV. How can we have victory over Satan?


The answer to this question is found in Ephesians chapter 6.

1. Ephesians 6:11-18

What does verse 11 tell us to do that we may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil? (Notice that we must **put on** the armor. God has provided the armor we need, but we must **put it on**. Notice it also says to put on the whole armor; we cannot afford to be partially prepared for this battle.) In verse 14 we are told to have our loins girt about with . Knowing the truth of God protects us from the lies of Satan. It is important for us to study the Bible on our own to help us to know the truth. It is also important for us to be faithful members of a church where the truth is preached and taught clearly. Verse 14 also tells us to have on the breastplate of _____. Righteousness protects our heart, and draws us closer to God. God hates wickedness! We cannot have close fellowship with God while we knowingly continue in our wicked ways. Verse 15 tells us to have our feet shod with the preparation of the _ _ _ _ of peace. The Christian should always be ready and eager to go and spread the Gospel to others. We

are commanded to GO into all the world and PREACH

THE GOSPEL to every creature. (Mark 16:15)



to use in our fight against Satan! The Word of God can help us to defeat our enemy and win the battle.

EXAMPLE: In Matthew chapter 4 Jesus was tempted by Satan. Three times Jesus responded to the temptation with the words, "It is _____." (Matthew 4:4, 7, 10) Jesus used Scripture to resist Satan's attacks. The Word of God is a powerful weapon! (See Hebrews 4:12)

This should challenge us to study and learn what the Word of God teaches so that we can use our spiritual sword more skillfully. We ought to also hide God's Word in our heart so that we will be ready to use it when needed.

Sober means "To exercise self-control; to be temperate; to be serious-minded." In other words, we are thinking clearly and we are in control of our self. We should avoid that which would cause us to make bad decisions or to be out of control—wild emotions, alcohol, etc.

Vigilant means "Awake, watchful, and attentive to discover and avoid danger." We have a very real and dangerous enemy. He is not to be messed with. We are no match to fight Satan on our own. We must be watchful and careful as we go through life.

NOTE: We do not need to live our lives in fear that Satan will defeat us. Yet, we ought to respect his power and be consistent to wear the spiritual armor that God has provided for us.

3. II Timothy 2:3-4

As soldiers of Jesus Christ we are called upon to endure _____. We must be willing to fight and continue even when life gets hard. We must press on through our difficulties. If we are going to stand against Satan, we must be resolved and firm in our decision to fight. DON'T QUIT! Keep on fighting! We are more than conquerors through Jesus Christ! (Romans 8:37) Greater is He that is in us than he that is in the world! (I John 4:4) We are on the winning side!

CONCLUSION

Satan, our enemy, is actively trying to deceive, harm, and tempt us to prevent us from serving God. We can be prepared to face our enemy. We have spiritual armor provided by God for us to wear. We can stand against Satan because we have the ALL POWERFUL Creator of Heaven and earth on our side!
