Establishing Biblical Standards

Introduction

What are standards?

Simply put, a standard is where you stand. It could be said that everyone has standards because everyone stands somewhere. Of course, we are not talking about standing in a physical location. No, as we discuss standards in this study, we are discussing how you should decide your position or your beliefs on various issues.

Often in church you will hear someone say, "Amen!" When someone says "Amen!" to what is being said, they are saying, "I stand where you stand." Amen = I stand where you stand. Look at Revelation 3:14. Who is "the Amen"? Jesus Christ! He is the One Who decides where we all should stand. Everyone has standards, but you need to make sure you are standing where Jesus stands.

One word closely connected with standards is separation. You will find that as you "stand up" for Jesus, you will "stand out" from the worldly crowd. The godly Christian lives by standards that set him apart from the world and unto God. This is what we call separation.

Let's look at what the Bible teaches about standards. Here are some topics our study will cover.

I. Standards are important.

1. II Corinthians 6:14-18

Notice in verse 14 that Paul did not want the Corinthian believers to be "yoked together" with certain groups or things.

2. I Peter 1:15, 16

That word "conversation" does not just mean words exchanged with others. No, it means your entire way and manner of life.

Holy is defined as "Properly, whole, entire or perfect, in a moral sense." (Webster's 1828 Dictionary). When God commands that you be holy, He expects you to be free from those things which make you morally impure. In simple terms, bad thoughts, bad actions, bad friends, bad words, and bad behavior all keep one from being holy.

Holy also means "consecrated or set apart to a sacred use." God has a special purpose for you. You should realize this, and it should make you think, and act, and live differently than those who have not yet discovered that God has a purpose for them as well. You should strive not to do those things that would keep you from doing the will of God for your life.

3. Matthew 23:25-28

Jesus was pretty tough on the scribes and Pharisees. Today, calling someone a "Pharisee" is an insult.

The Pharisees had high standards and lived separated from the world. However, they did not have the personal holiness on the inside to back it up. Jesus calls the Pharisees "whited s_____" in verse 27. Outside they looked nice and polished, but inside they were full of what? _____

As you get closer to God, it matters more to you what He thinks and what His opinions and preferences are. Your relationship with God will provoke you to establish certain rules of behavior in your life (standards). But realize that it does not work the other way around. Establishing certain standards does not necessarily bring you any closer to God.

4. 1 Samuel 16:7

God knows the intentions of your heart, but man does not. Man can only judge your actions which tell him where you stand. Your actions are important because people are watching you.

See also Matthew 5:16 and 1 Thessalonians 5:22.

First, make sure your heart is right with God. Then, make sure what others see about your life matches your heart.

In Conclusion

Your standards are important! God wants you to stand with Him. This lesson deals with where you should stand; but realize if you strive for personal holiness within, that will greatly impact where you stand in relation to the world. Also, you should stand where God wants you to stand because others are watching you.

In Conclusion

The Bible is very clear in many areas about where we should stand. Above we have listed just a few examples of how clear the Bible can be about a matter. American author Mark Twain stated, "It's not the things I *don't understand* in the *Bible* that bother me, it's the things I do *understand*!" You will never be standing where God wants you to stand until you start standing where you *know* God wants you to stand.

III. When the Bible is not clear concerning certain areas of behavior, God has given us Bible principles to follow.

There are quite a few issues that believers will face once they become faithful to church. Dress, entertainment, music, friendships, and dating are just a few of the areas in which you will need to determine where you stand. What makes it difficult is that words such as "knee-length," "movie," "DVD," "mp3," "novel," "cigarette," "hip-hop," "gambling," and "internet" do not appear in Scripture.

However, God does not leave us without direction and guidance. The Bible is a living, eternal Book. The Bible contains eternal principles that can guide us even in questionable matters.

1. 1 Corinthians 6:15-20

Who lives inside of the believer? the H _ _ _ G _ _ _ _

Wherever a Christian goes, the Holy Spirit goes with that believer. Is there any place that you could take the Holy Spirit that would be displeasing to God? *Please circle one* -**Yes** or **No**

Then the believer should not force the Holy Ghost to put up with those things either. We should not allow those things to be brought inside our bodies which are the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit.

2. 2 Corinthians 6:14-18

We examined this passage earlier. What principles to live by can we glean from these verses?

3. 1 Thessalonians 5:22

This verse is a principle to guide you not just with what you are doing, but with what it appears you are doing.

Should a Christian avoid places of sinful activity like drinking alcohol so that others would not think that they were also partaking in the sin? *Please circle one* - **Yes** or **No**

4. 1 Corinthians 10:31

In any questionable matter, ask yourself, "Can I do this thing to the ____ of God?" If not, you should not do it.

5. Romans 2:14, 15

Ask yourself, "Does it violate my conscience?"

Conscience = the inner sense of what is right or wrong in one's conduct or motives, impelling one toward right action. (Dictionary.com)

Your conscience is a gift from God. Now, your conscience can become seared (damaged, made numb), but if your conscience is telling you that you should not do something, then the wise thing would be not to do it.

If you really want to stand with Jesus Christ, then you will search the Scriptures for Bible principles to live by. In situations where there is no clear commandment of Scripture, you will allow the principle to guide you in your decisions.

CONCLUSION

Sometimes you will not be able to find a Bible command or even a Bible principle to guide your decisions. There are a couple of thoughts that you may find helpful. First of all, Romans 14:23 teaches us that whatsoever is not of faith is sin. In other words, "when in doubt, don't." Delay in making the decision until you can find a Bible principle upon which to base your decision.

In such times that you cannot find a Bible principle to govern a particular area of your life, remember that God has given you godly leaders to help guide you. What a gift the pastor is to the local church and to individual believers!

When you are in doubt, go to your spiritual leaders for guidance. Ask yourself, "What would my pastor do in this situation?" Most likely your spiritual leader has already established his own standards based upon his understanding of the Scriptures. He or she can help guide you when you are in doubt. As with any decision, if you are in doubt, delay your decision.

In your heart, you should determine that you want to stand where Jesus Christ, the Amen, stands! Your love for God and your desire to be more like God should motivate you to develop personal standards of holiness. In many issues, the Bible gives clear commands. In others, the Bible provides clear principles to live by. If you are still in doubt, seek help and guidance from the spiritual leaders God has placed in your life.
